








UPPER LEVEL

IN THE MEDIA CENTRE

The Media Centre is located on the Formula 1° Paddock (driver's right). All accredited journalists and photographers must register at the Media Centre Reception on the lower level of the building on first arriving at the circuit. Staff at Reception will assist with seating allocation, internet access and locker keys if required.

> Standard telephone and it services

Standard phone services will be available to all media without a connection fee. Phones will be available in the Media Telecom Centre located on the lower level of the Media Centre, also in this room, there will be computers with internet and printing access.

> Free wireless internet

Free wireless internet will be available in the Media Centre and Photographer's Centre. This network will allow 50 Mbps services for national and international press. Ethernet will be allowed in the Photographer's area, This will include internet browsing, mail servicesand FTP services. A technician is available everyday (during opening hours). Inquire at the Reception Desk.

> Electrical power

Each workstation is equipped with power outlets. Voltage in Mexico is 114-140 volts. Members of the international press must inquire about the compatibility of their electronic and electric devices. To obtain a transformer, please inquire at the reception desk.

> Lockers

Lockers are available on the upper and lower levels for photographers and press with a refundable deposit of \$200 MXN o \$20 USD o \$20 EUR.



STILL 'FIERCE YOUNG MEN?'

FORMULA 1 REJUVENATED IN 2025

They say it's a young man's world – and F1 2025 is putting that saying into high-speed practice, with no fewer than five rookies in the field for this year's Mexico City Grand Prix on October 24-26.

One of the five is a young man whose career stirs memories of a Mexican driver whose life was cut tragically short right here at the Autódromo Hermanos Rodríguez almost 63 years ago.

Andrea Kimi Antonelli will be 19 when he takes to the track, the same age as Ricardo Rodriguez was when he made his World Championship debut at Monza, Italy, in 1961. A year later, entering his home race in a Lotus 24 because there was no Ferrari for him to drive, Ricardo was quickest in the first practice session – until John Surtees went faster.

The youthful local hero decided he must go out again, only to lose control in the Peraltada, which in those days was a daunting, banked, high-speed right-hander, and crash fatally. 'A fierce young man who drives with a terrifying carelessness,' was how Enzo Ferrari himself described the younger of the Rodríguez brothers after whom the Mexican track is named. Antonelli too is 'a fierce young man' – fierce in his ambition to excel in a sport where he is by some distance the youngest man in the field. But another driver who is the youngest-ever in F1, Max Verstappen, describes the Italian youngster as 'level-headed and calm', and those attributes are standing Kimi in good stead in a tough first season with Mercedes.

Kimi himself says he is 'someone who trusts his instincts', as the younger Rodríguez always did. When his Ferrari crew at that Monza debut asked Ricardo to detail the gears he used in certain corners and his braking-points he said, slightly panic-stricken, 'I don't know what to tell them!' He just got in the car and drove its wheels off.

No such problem for Antonelli: today's telemetry tells his team exactly what he is doing at practically every single yard of the track. 'A lot to learn,' he has admitted, and it is hard to believe that until the European summer of this year, he

was also still learning a lot... at school. And he passed his civil driving test just six weeks before his F1 debut.

Some of F1's most experienced insiders, however, have already labelled Antonelli as a future giant of the sport. Although Kimi crashed his Mercedes just 10 minutes into his debut in the first free practice session at Monza in 2024, British journalist Mark Hughes had seen enough to compare him to a legendary compatriot: the peerless Tazio Nuvolari.

Almost 100 years earlier, in his own debut at Monza, Nuvolari was blindingly fast until he crashed within six laps. Antonelli, on his first push lap at Monza, went fastest of all – then crashed out of the session. 'All good, Kimi,' said Mercedes boss Toto Wolff over the radio. 'Kimi, all good.' So good that Wolff was encouraged, the very next day, to announce that Antonelli would replace Lewis Hamilton for 2025.

In his first six races this season Antonelli was in the points five times; he became the youngest man to set an official fastest race lap in F1; and he finished on the podium in Canada, the youngest driver to do so since Verstappen himself and Aston Martin's Lance Stroll.

Popular and respected Mexican motor sport veteran Jo Ramirez, a close friend of the Rodriguez brothers, has said, 'Ricardo, for sure, was going to be one of the greatest'. Will Antonelli realize the dream that was taken so soon from the fierce young man from Mexico?

Youth must have its fling, but we should not forget that this season's grid also boasts two drivers aged over 40, while the oldest driver pairing has a combined age of 71. The seemingly indefatigable Fernando Alonso is now 44, but the Spaniard still has a way to go before he can become F1's oldest racewinner. That honor belongs to Italian Luigi Fagioli, who was a boyish 53 when he co-drove an Alfa-Romeo to victory with Juan Manuel Fangio in the French Grand Prix of 1951

Two-time Mexico winner Lewis Hamilton has also just passed the 40-year mark. And the third-oldest driver in this year's



race grabbed some of the biggest headlines of the year when he achieved his maiden F1 podium in July, approaching the ripe old age of 38.

That third 'old man' is Germany's Nico Hülkenberg. At Silverstone in July 'The Hulk', born in August 1987, stood on the F1 podium for the first time at the 239th time of asking, prompting World Championship leader Oscar Piastri to say that Nico's podium was the highlight of the day.

'I am ecstatic – this is such a special day for the team and for me personally,' said the popular German. 'That first podium feeling... I cannot put it into words. It was such an intense race with changing conditions all the time, and you always feel like you are right on the edge. Starting from last on the grid and finishing on the podium honestly feels kind of surreal. It's going to take a few days, a few moments, to process everything and take it all in."

With a combined age of just 44, Racing Bulls' Liam Lawson and Isaak Hadjar form the youngest pairing on a grid whose overall average age is 27, the point at which most elite sportsmen are in their prime. And this year some F1 veterans are seeing lots to like.

Stefan Johansson, who drove for eight teams including McLaren and Ferrari in his 79-race career, says: 'First of all, across the board now, I think the standard of drivers is probably as high as it's ever been in F1. They're all really, really, really good drivers, really fast drivers. I don't think F1 has ever been closer from top to bottom than it is now. It's incredible.'

David Coulthard, winner of 13 Grands Prix for Williams and McLaren, is also impressed by the 2025 field:

'Some of the rookies have also been really impressive,' he says. 'They've shown they were good in the lesser formulae;

suddenly they come to F1 against drivers we know are good, and they're really showing their speed. In the past we've had a couple of drivers where you go, 'They're passing through', but it doesn't feel like that. The drivers are there on merit and they're doing a good job — they're all good.'



'IT HAD TO BE IN MEXICO'

RACERS TURN INTO ROCK STARS IN CITY'S THIRD F1 ERA

The Mexico City Grand Prix 2025 brings the 10th running of the race in Formula 1's third stay in the Mexican capital – and last year's winner captured the impact the season's most colorful event has had on the F1 scene. 'I think everyone knew that I wanted one more race win with Ferrari,' said Carlos Sainz. 'Eventually it happened, and it had to be in Mexico, in front of my family, which is great. It doesn't mean that I'm not going to try and win more. But it had to be in Mexico.'

After years of dominance by Mercedes and Red Bull, in 2024 another team was triumphant at last – and it was the greatest name in F1 history, as Sainz claimed his final victory in a scarlet car. The 30-year-old Spaniard already knew he was leaving the fabled Scuderia, making his Mexican success all the sweeter.

Mexico's first F1 era began with a non-Championship race in November 1962 – the weekend where Ricardo Rodriguez lost his life in an accident in the fearsome Peraltada curve. A year later it was official: Scotland's Jim Clark won the first 'real' World Championship race in Mexico in his Lotus Climax. F1's first Mexican festival lasted until 1970, when Jackie Ickx's Ferrari led the field home.

The circus stayed away until 1986, when Gerhard Berger and Benetton gave a colorful winning start to F1's new life in Mexico. That second era lasted seven years, Nigel Mansell taking out the last race for Williams Renault in 1992.

For 23 long years, Mexican F1 fans – some of the most knowledgeable and passionate on the planet – waited for F1 to come back again. Now here we are, a decade later, ready to celebrate 10 raucous years of being a spectacular part of the finest racing series in the world.

Already, it's the longest-running F1 era Mexico has ever enjoyed. Its first winner was Nico Rosberg, who drove alongside Lewis Hamilton in the dominant Mercedes team of the time. Highly respected F1 commentator Martin Brundle, who raced in Mexico five times in his own career, was thrilled to be back.

'In a certain way,' he observed, 'the race was secondary to the event itself. From start to finish the weekend felt a success, with Latin-American flair combining with the constant backdrop of music and knowledgeable fans, passionate about motor sport and F1, to produce a buzzing atmosphere throughout.'

Hamilton won the second race of the new era, then Red Bull took center stage as Max Verstappen launched a personal attack on the AHR. The Flying Dutchman took five wins in the next six years, a sequence interrupted only in 2019 when Hamilton took his own second win here – coincidentally, the 100th victory for Mercedes in F1.

Of course a Mexican winner would have made this third era complete, but try as he might, Sergio Pérez never quite got there. Still, in 2021 Checo was the first Mexican driver to lead the race, and the first to finish on the podium when he was third behind Verstappen and Hamilton.

Back in 2019, when he finished seventh for Racing Point, Checo had said, 'It feels like a victory!' after the reception the home crowd gave him. While a home win

was never to be, Checo never forget their support: 'I owe these fans,' he said during his final AHR weekend in 2024. 'They are the best in the world, this is the best race in the world.'

Hamilton, too, was quick to acknowledge the special nature of the Mexican event after his second victory in 2019. 'Firstly,' he said, 'we've got to acknowledge this incredible crowd. This is like the best crowd I've ever seen – we've never seen anything like this!'

That's because of the X-factor that makes Mexico such a memorable place to go racing. Not only was AHR the highest circuit on the F1 calendar – it was also the noisiest! One section in particular has become a firm favorite with those in the cockpit and those packed into the stands.

Speaking of which, the realigned layout for F1's return in 2015 took the circuit away from the once flat-out Peraltada at the end of the lap. Instead the cars now get up close and personal as they cruise through the chicane between the towering grandstands of the baseball park – the legendary Foro Sol.

In 2025 it will be a surprise if McLaren does not win in Mexico, so dominant has the new-look team led by Zak Brown and Andrea Stella become. If Lando Norris or Oscar Piastri should be on the top step of the AHR podium, right there in the Foro Sol, looking at a riot of color and hearing the Mexican crowd, they need only think back to 2015.

In that memorable Mexican year, as Nico Rosberg reacted to his victory and the thunderous reception from the AHR fans, he summed up the occasion superbly: 'I felt like a rock star!'

As Carlos Sainz said, for that, it had to be Mexico...





THREE INTO ONE WON'T GO

SO MUCH STILL TO PLAY FOR AT AHR

As the 10 Formula 1 teams arrive in Mexico, Max Verstappen is in the most dangerous place he can be inside the McLaren drivers' heads.

Red Bull's Dutchman, English driver Lando Norris and Australian Oscar Piastri are all going for the same prize: the Formula One Drivers' World Championship, which is still up for grabs as we head into the 10th Grand Prix of Mexico's modern F1 era.

McLaren have already clinched their second successive Constructors' title, and it seemed only a matter of time before the Drivers' title would follow. But McLaren's fabled 'papaya rules', recognizing the team's iconic original colors and leaving the drivers free to race, have come under increasing strain.

Victory in Austin means Verstappen's revitalised Red Bull has won three of the last four races; he has cut the gap to Championship leader Piastri to 40 points, and only 26 points now separate him from Norris. Clashes between the two McLaren men in Singapore and again in the Sprint race in Texas have heightened tensions – and Verstappen is now in with a real chance of a fifth straight Drivers' crown as the McLaren pair look over both shoulders.

No sooner had McLaren secured their 10th Constructors' title, second only to Ferrari, than CEO Zak Brown was saying: 'You can't win the Constructors' without two awesome race drivers. As you can see, we're letting them race. There's a lot of races to go and hopefully there's some more victories for both of them.'

It's a syndrome we've seen in F1 so many times before: Jones and Reutemann at Williams... Senna and Prost (also at McLaren)... Vettel and Webber at Red Bull. It has never ended well.

Piastri has won seven races so far this season to Norris's five. But it's the Australian who seems more aggrieved as races come and go and papaya seems to be favoring his teammate: he was upset at being asked to give Norris a place back in Monza, and outraged in Singapore after Norris bounced off Verstappen's Red Bull and into the side of Piastri's car at the start.

'That wasn't very team-like,' Piastri complained, adding, 'That's not fair.' Who said F1 was ever going to be fair? The post-race frost melted enough for team-like celebrations, but with one title under their belts, will McLaren stick to their papaya rules for the last few races of the season?

Norris said last week that he faces 'consequences' after his Singapore moment, and that the team had held him accountable. Piastri added: 'The conclusion was what happened in Singapore is not how we want to go racing as a team, and ultimately Lando has taken responsibility for it. That's in the past now, and the rules won't change because of that." We shall see...

Four races have come and gone since the last McLaren victory of 2025, and the man who grabs the next one will surely feel the momentum is on his side as they hit the season's finishing straight. But might that be Max? He has five wins too, and an outstanding record at this circuit...

To add spice, McLaren have not won in Mexico since the city's third era of F1 racing began in 2015. In fact we must go back to 1989 for the last time a McLaren came home first in Mexico, in the hands of Ayrton Senna. And there were only two other McLaren victories here before then: for Alain Prost in 1988, and for Denny Hulme way back in 1969. So a win for either McLaren man would be very welcome – or would it? F1's rumor mill is a powerful piece of machinery, and it's been churning out suggestions that a disgruntled Piastri may already be looking for an exit from McLaren. What happens at the



Autódromo Hermanos Rodriguez this weekend could have a big bearing on how that plays out...

Might Mercedes Russell up another win?

Last week came the news that Mercedes will retain both drivers, George Russell and Kimi Antonelli, for 2026. 'A massive reset,' the Englishman called it, 'and an exciting one. If I could have every single seat available to me, I would still choose Mercedes.' It's been a long time coming, but could the new deal be the catalyst for a third win of 2025 for the Silver Arrows? Russell was in splendid form in Canada and Singapore, winning from pole at both circuits, and with six other podiums he has been one of the stand-outs of the season. His junior partner, 19-year-old Italian Antonelli, has been at times 'underwhelming', to quote team boss Toto Wolff, but flashes of brilliance have seen him claim a Sprint pole, a podium in Montreal and a couple of fastest race laps.

'I'm useless, absolutely useless'

That was the anguished cry from two-time Mexico winner Lewis Hamilton after he failed to reach the final stage of Qualifying in Hungary, where his Ferrari teammate Charles Leclerc took pole position. It's fair to say Hamilton's first season at Maranello has not gone as expected: no poles, no wins, not even a single podium after 19 races. Not surprising, after long spells at McLaren and particularly Mercedes, where the team was shaped around the Englishman's talents. But... Lewis claimed the fastest race lap in Singapore, and finished fourth in Texas, so perhaps things are on the up and up. He's been on the AHR podium no fewer than six times: could this be lucky seventh?

Who else has something to play for?


Look out for a resurgent Williams team, bidding to make fifth place safe in the Constructors' standings, where they lead Racing Bulls by 39 points.
